**Outstanding Kindness Award - Pupil** 

This Outstanding Kindness Award will be awarded to an individual pupil who has demonstrated an exceptional level of kindness within their school or community during the 25/26 school year.

- Open to individual pupils from reception through to year 6.
- Nominations should provide details of what the child has done, and the impact it has had on others within their school or community.
- Children may not nominate themselves, but they may nominate another child (via a teacher/parent/guardian).
- If you are a parent / guardian and wish to nominate your own child, please upload a supporting letter from your child's teacher as part of your nomination (if your child is home-schooled, please contact us for some extra guidance).

Inspiration: Has someone started a kindness initiative within school that has made a big difference to other children? Perhaps they have gone above and beyond to help a fellow pupil or staff member? Have they done something extraordinary to help their local community?

## **Graham Spivey Outstanding Kindness Award - Adult**

The Graham Spivey Outstanding Kindness Award will be awarded to an individual adult working within a school who has demonstrated an exceptional level of kindness during the 25/26 school year.

- Open to any adult working within a school (for example a teacher, a cleaner, a catering staff member etc).
- Children may submit nominations, but it must be done via a teacher/parent/guardian.
- People may not nominate themselves.

Nominations should provide details of:

- What the person has done to demonstrate an exceptional level of kindness.
- The impact they have had on those around them.

Inspiration: Is there a teacher who has done something special to support a colleague or pupil? Is there a caretaker who goes the extra mile? Is there a member of the catering team who has helped to create a wonderful working environment?

#### **NOMINATE NOW**

This award is dedicated to the memory of Graham Spivey, a cherished former trustee of 52 Lives, whose kindness and compassion left a lasting legacy.



This Collective Kindness Award will be awarded to a class or school group that has demonstrated an exceptional level of kindness during the 25/26 school year.

- Open to any class or organised group (for example a club or council) within the school.
- People may nominate their own group.
- Children may submit nominations, but it should be done via a teacher/parent/ guardian.

Inspiration: Has your school council launched a kindness initiative within the school that has had a big impact? Has an after-school club helped significantly with a worthwhile cause. Or is there a class that has worked together to create an extra kind culture within their classroom?

Nominations should provide detail of:

- What the class/group has done to demonstrate an exceptional level of kindness.
- Who was involved.
- What difference it has made
- It is expected that supporting evidence would be submitted with the nomination.

**NOMINATE NOW** 



This is our flagship award, and as such, we ask for a detailed nomination. Entries must come from the head teacher or a member of the senior leadership team. Please provide specific examples and include evidence to support your nomination. We'd like to know:

- Why your school deserves to win the Kind School Award.
- How and why kindness has become such an important feature of your school.
- What initiatives, policies, or practices you've introduced to foster kindness among pupils, staff, and families.
- What measurable impact these efforts have had on individuals or the wider school culture
- How your school has shared kindness beyond the classroom, within your local or global community.

We know there's already an incredible amount of kindness happening in schools across the country, and we'd love to hear about it! To spark ideas, here are some examples of what might feature in a Kind School (these are just suggestions - we welcome creativity and innovation):

• Regular kindness or wellbeing lessons, exploring empathy, the science of kindness, and emotional literacy.



- A student-led kindness council or inclusion of kindness as a standing agenda item in school council meetings.
- Kindness ambassadors or peer mentors supporting pupils and promoting positive relationships.
- Staff wellbeing programmes that model self-kindness and compassion.
- Leadership that models kindness and empathy.
- Recognition systems (e.g. Kindness Awards, kindness walls, or shout-outs) celebrating kind acts.
- Community kindness projects, extending kindness beyond the school gates.
- Kindness to the planet initiatives e.g., eco projects.

While the nomination form has a word limit, we ask that you provide evidence to support your narrative. You may include up to four supporting documents (max 10MB each) with your entry. This could include things such as photographs, lesson plans, newsletters, feedback, or impact reports - anything that helps us see and feel the kindness in action. Please ensure all attachments clearly relate to your submission.
